HOW TO PLAY BACCARAT

THE RECENT CAME AT TRANSY CROFT, ENGLAND.

Little Known in America, but a Pavorite with European Nobility-A Game of Pure Chance - How Cheating Can He Done.

Several attempts have been made to describe the game of bacearat, but the results produced by those who would tell how the cards are manipulated bave been such as to leave the reader with little knowledge of the game. It is necessary first that the person who attempts to describe baccarat should be a player. Talking from the book will not do. The game is too intrincte.

The game is very firstle known in America, and it's strictly a foreign affair. The nobility of Europe are fond of it, and the Prince of Wales sceps to nave been particularly fassionated with it. Several attempts have been made to

Hoyle says that baccarat is a game are pure chance, and bears some re-semblance to "lighter un" or "Twen-tyone." but is a much more rapid game, and great fortunes can be won and lest at becarat in an almost in-credibly short space of time. The bunker or the players either win or lose as they approximate a point which is nine.

After the first round the dealer then deals his card, or cards, to the player sitting part to the one nearest him left. sitting next to the one nearest him left and right, and all those on their re-spective sides bet on the new players' hands. This system is least

is for players and banker to strive to get the point of nine. If the right-hand players make seven by counting hand players make seven by counting that many spots on the card or cards their player holds, the left-hand play-ers get live in the same way, and the banker can count six spots on his card or cards then the bank pays all the bets made by the right hand side players, and rakes in all the moneys and chips put up by the left hand side players. The banker's six was one point less than the players on the right, and he therefore lost to them, and they were one point in excess of what the other side had.
