## SIXTY LIVES LOST

Awful Work of the Hurricane at Martinique.

NOT A VESSEL THERE ESCAPED.

The Damage Done to Shipping and Property is Stupendons.

All Plantations About the Island Destrayed-Houses and Barns Crushed Out of Existence-Several Persons West Mad from Fear-The Night Was One of Extrems Terror-Further Details Expected Panis, Aug. 21.-Later official advices

just received state that the calamity which has visited Martinique is the most severe since the year 1817. The disaster lassid to be equal to the famous cyclone which swept over the island of Antigua

So far as can be learned there have been nearly 90 deaths as a result of the hurricane's visitation, but it will be some time before the full extent of the disaster is known.

At Port-de-France alone there have been 12 deaths. At St. Plerra five persons are known to have been killed; at Lamentes 10, Francels 16, Eiviere Pilote 2 and at La Trinte 10. At all the above places large numbers

of persons were injured.

The damage done to shipping and property is stupendous. About two-lifths of the island was under cultivaintis of the maind was under cultiva-tion and the mountain slopes were cov-ered with forests; all the forests and all the cultivation in the path of the hurri cane appear to be swept away and a number of lives lost in the country dis-

tricts.

The numerous sugar, coffee, cotton and cocca plantations which have felt the force of the tornado seem to have been utterly destroyed.

Houses and barns, stock houses and

stables have been crusted out of exist-ence, and a considerable period must elapse before the island recovers from its

shapse before the Island recovers from its terrible visitation.

There was some warning of the ap-proach of the terrible wind, and thus many of the sallors escaped with their lives. But even in this case the loss of iffe is not known. Some of the vessuls appear to have been carried bodily up the beach by the fearful wind and waves; others foundered at their anchorage, and others still alongside their wharves.

#### GHASTLY HANGING SCENE. The Victim's Bead Was Practically Torn from His Body.

LIVERSOOL, Aug. 21 .- A sickening and altogether frightful occurrence marked the execution of John Conway, who was

the execution of John Conway, who was hanged here for the murder of the boy Nicholas Martin.

As Berry, the hangman, was drawing the black cap over Conway's head the latter shouted: "Hold ou. I want to say something," Berry replied: "You can't speak now," and was about to pro-ceed with the execution when the priest, who was in attemplanes upon the griminal who was in attendance upon the criminal npon the scaffold, hastily interposed, pushed the hangman one side, and held Conway's hand while the condemned man, in broken tones, asked forgiveness

Only when the unfortunate wretch had Only when the unfortunate wretch had done speaking and when the priest had replied to his pies for forgiveness did the latter permit the hangman to proceed. The incident caused intense excitement

among those present at the hanging, but

among those present at the hanging, but it was an acting compared to the horrible scene which was to follow.

In due course of time the drop fell and Canway disappeared from view. Almost immediately afterwards the priest began to read the confession of the hanging man.

To this confession Conway said that he was intoxicited when he muritared the boy, and that his reason for taking the hoy's life was that he had a morbid curiosity to observe the process of dying.

While the priest was reading Conway's confession a atreaming sound was heard from the scaffold, as if a quantity of water was falling.

A curried investigation was made by the hangman and by the prison officials, and to their licror they found sunt the sound was caused by blood which was pouring upon the floor from Conway's

neck.

The Lill, it appears, had been so severe that the criminal's head had been peactically form from his body, in fact, the head was only beld to the body by the muscles of the neck.
