Terms used in science, handicraft and special subjects are gathered with great completeness and grouped without definition under the general word, and each besides is defined in its proper view. Thus proder "nounding." and each, besides, is defined in its prop-er place. Thus, under "plumbing," we have all the terms used to that trade; under "apple," the names of nearly 400 varieties are given. The book will contain about 2,200 pages and 70,000 more words than any other single-volumned dictionary. It will have plotorial illustrations on every page. It promises to rival all the great lexicons of our day, and in its special features will be the greatest work of its kind. No scholar will want to be without it.
