

### Reduction in Condition of Cotton.

Washington, Sep. 11.—The September eport of the Department of Agriculture report of the Department of Agriculture marks a reduction in condition of cotton, during the past month of six points, from 88.9 to 82.7. August is a critical period in the growth of the cotton plant, and sixteen times in twenty years has deterioration been indicated by the returns of September 1st. The cause of the present reduction, on the Atlantic coast, has been an excess of rainfall, causing overgrowth of the plant and diminishing the tendency of fruitage.
