Nicaraugus and Salvador Want One Half . Acre Each for Their Exhibits-

The Humors of Buyofatten to Nicarago Untrue-The World's Pair Declied a Privote Enterprise by Secretary Grant-Commissioner of Pennises Baum May Soon Resigns-Other Washington Notes.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sep. 28. - Lieuten ant Berlyon, of the Army, apielul commissioner to Central America for the World's Fair, writes from Nicaragua, saying that after some preliminary con-sultation, Mr. Salaverri, the commissinner appointed to represent Micavagua, at the expedition, the president of that Republic, and the ministers of public works, had a final conference at which it was decided to creet a building in Jackson Park for the Nicaraguan exhibit, at a cost of not less than ten and not more than twelve thousand dollars, and an official application was made for about one-half acre of land. A similar reserva-vation has been asked by the governor of Salvador.

"The government is thoroughly interested," Lieutenant Seriven reports, "and the President is doing everything in his power to interest the people in sending the products of the country to Chicago."
