**A Car Inspector Worth \$300,000.**

Robert Lawrence, a car inspector in the employ of the Philadelphia & Reading R. R. at Gordon, was caught between the cars a few days ago and injured so badly that he died Monday evening. His remains were taken to Brooklyn for interment this morning. This paragraph announces the death of a man remarkable for the fact that while estimated to possess wealth aggregating \$300,000 in lands and securities he has for the past 35 years been engaged in the lowly occupation of a car inspector at the foot of Gordon Pines. Born near Port Jarvis, N. Y., nearly 90 years ago, he was for about 20 years engaged on the Delaware & Hudson Railroad, furnishing horses for the movement of traffic about Waymart. In 1855 he left there with about \$40,000 for Brooklyn, N. Y., where his sisters resided, on a change of management of the company, and coming in contact with some official of the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad, asked for and secured employment as a car inspector, and continued in the company's service until his death. He has no known relatives but a sister in Brooklyn who, unless a will otherwise disposing of his wealth shall be found, inherits all his possessions. In early childhood he, with his brothers and sisters, sold the old farm near Port Jarvis and invested the proceeds in lots in Brooklyn, which it is believed he held at the time of his death, and which have vastly increased in value since then. While he was employed at Waymart our townsman, Michael O'Hara became intimately associated in a reciprocal friendship which ends at his grave in Brooklyn to-day, to which place Mr. O'Hara accompanied his remains.
