Bosron, Nov. 5. - The facts regarding the loans of the Maverick Bank have been in possession of the Comptroller of the Currancy since last January, and it is now intimated that another Comptroller is likely to be appointed before

The general long account outside of the \$2,400,000 due from directors and the Evans losses is good, and shows good judgment and careful banking. The directors' loans have still considerable collateral behind them.


