ALMY SAYS GUILTY

Christie Warden's Murderer Confesses in Court.

HANGED IN EFFIGY AT MIDNIGHT

Excitement Caused By Fear That He Has Cheated the Gallows.

Crowds at the Station to See the Murderer Taken From Manchester to Plymouth—Evidence in the Case to Be Taken by the Court—The New Hampshire Law.

PLYMOUTH, N. H., Nov. 17.—Frank Almy, slayer of Christie Warden, pleaded guilty of his crime in the Court House here yesterday.

The silence in the court-room, only broken by the questions and answers, was awful. The murderer himself was as cool as ice until he tried to say that onlooker word "guilty." Even his nerve was then shaken.

Almy was taken from the Manchester jail to Plymouth in a special car.

At Concord and Laconia hundreds of excited, protesting men, women and children crowded all over the special car, mounted the platform, ascended wooden chairs and took every vantage spot from which they could see the face of Almy.

At midnight Almy was hanged in effigy by the citizens from a rope stretched across the principal street.

After Almy pleaded guilty Judge Doe directed that the 80 special jurors be dismissed.

A Firebug Arrested. GENEVA, N.Y., Nov. 17.—Fred White, hostler at the Geneva Hotel, which was burned Sunday, was charged with starting the fire, and finally admitted his guilt. As the examination by the jury is closed, it is thought that he also will be to the buildings in Seneca Falls. When arrested he appeared to be suffering from delirium tremens.

Indicted for Murder. NEWTON, R. I., Nov. 17.—The grand jury yesterday indicted Georgians Thompson for murder. A short time ago the Thompson woman confessed to being the mother of the child found in the harbor off Fort Greene. She was arraigned and pleaded not guilty.

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REJOICES IN MURDER

Naval Apprentice Wise and His Heinous Deed.

TREW A FRIEND OVER A CLIFF.

Both Mere Boys Who Were Serving on an English Training Ship.

The Murderer Confesses and Alleges as His Motive that He Wants to Be Hanged—Treats the Whole Affair as a Joke and is Ticked at the Prospect of Meeting Death at the Rope's End.

LONDON, Nov. 17.—The town of Weymouth has a sensation which is a matter of general discussion among the regular inhabitants of the place and among the large number of persons who, owing to the salubrity of its climate, spend the autumn and winter there.

The excitement was caused by the arrest of a youth named Wise, who is only 17 years of age, on the charge of murder.

The case is peculiar in many of its details in that there was seemingly no motive for the crime, and that the murderer displays neither fear of the consequences nor remorse for his action.

Wise is one of the apprentices belonging to H. M. training ship Bosawan, sixteen guns, Commander G. A. Mynors.

Among those who were given liberty were Wise and another youth, who, when they reached the shore, started for a stroll on the cliffs.

Finally they reached a point where the cliffs stand 70 feet above the narrow stretch of shore beneath.

When Wise's companion did not return at the expiration of the time allowed to him, the officers of the ship made inquiries, and when they questioned Wise, the latter told them that he had pushed him over the cliff.

An investigation was immediately made, and on reaching a spot on the shore beneath the point indicated by Wise in his confession, the officers found the body of the boy. His skull had been fractured by striking on the jagged rocks and he had received other terrible injuries. He was alive when the searchers found him, but he died in a short time.

Wise was immediately placed under arrest, but he takes the whole affair nonchalantly, and laughs and jokes as though he had no heinous crime upon his conscience.

Before he murdered his friend he had often, in the course of conversation with other boys on the ship, expressed a desire to be hanged.

As the case stands at present the only possible reason that can be given for the heinous murder is that Wise is afflicted with a morbid desire to obtain notoriety, or that he is mentally irresponsible for his actions.
