More Trouble in Brazil.
RIO JANEIRO, Nov. 28.—The Peixotto government has made a demand on Rio Grande do Sul for the reinstatement of the local government as it existed before the outbreak against Fonseca. The Rio Grande Junta has refused to obey this demand, and threatens to offer forcible resistance to any attempt to compel obedience. Owing to the rivalry of the army and navy for influence in political affairs, the jealousy between the two branches of the public service is becoming acute.

Keystone Bank Stockholders Sued.
PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 28.—Robert M. Yardley, receiver of the Keystone National Bank, has brought 87 suits in the United States District Court against as many stockholders of the Keystone Bank, for the assessment of \$50 upon each share of stock held by them. The aggregate number of shares upon which suit is brought is 4,138, the assessments upon which amount to \$205,150.

Former Legislator in Trouble.
PITTSBURGH, Nov. 28.—Westmoreland County politicians are excited over the arrest of George F. Blackburn, of West Newton, a former member of the State Legislature, for alleged issuing of bogus tax receipts to voters at the recent election. He claims to be innocent. A hearing will be had on Monday.

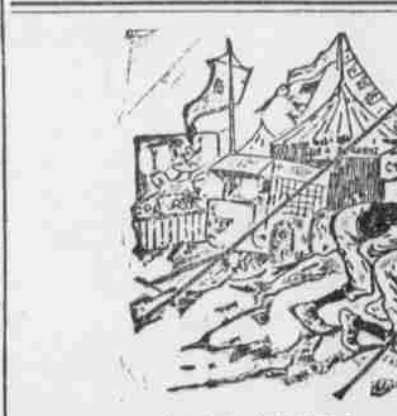

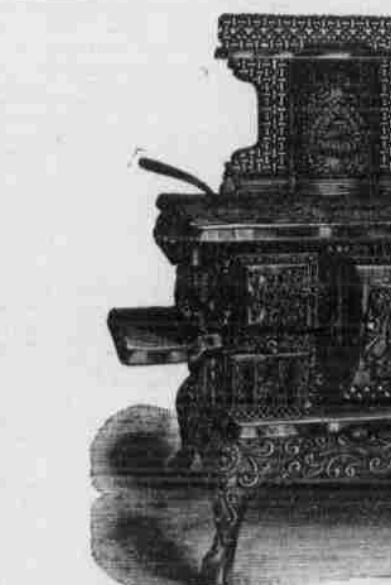
