WASHINGTON, Dec. 23.—Frederick Douglass has been ailing for some time past, and of late his strength has been rapidly declining. One evening last week while lecturing at the Academy of Music, in Philadelphia, on "Hayti," he broke down in the midst of a stirring sentence and had to be carried from the stage by two of those upon the platform, and is now quite ill. He has been compelled to decline invitations to speak at different places after New Year.

A Missing Hair Found.
WHEELING, W. Va., Dec. 23.—John Given, the missing hair to the immense Given estate at Cortland, N. Y., is here. He has been missing since last June, when he left for San Francisco. He was heard from on his arrival there, and then all trace of him was entirely lost. His baggage was found in San Francisco, and it was supposed he had been murdered and the body concealed.
