#### Protest Against the Bills.

TRENTON, N. J., Feb. 15.—In all the churches in New Jersey there was read yesterday the appeal issued by the Citizens League of New Jersey, urging all law-abiding citizens to meet in Trenton at noon to-morrow, to protest against the passage of the race track bills which are now pending. Arrangements have been made for the running of excursion trains from all parts of the State, and the indications now point to a general invasion of the State Capital by at least two thousand people. Delegations are expected from Paterson, Elizabeth, Newark, Jersey City, Trenton, and Camden.

#### Threatened With Annihilation.

Mysric, Iowa, Feb. 15.-This prosperous mining town is threatened with an-nihilation by the action of the Iowa Central Railway in raising rates on coal to a point where it cannot be shipped at a profit. Heretofore 1,200 car loads a a profit. Heretofore 1,200 car loads a month have been shipped to Mason City, St. Paul and Minneapolis, but since the new rate went into effect the mines have shut down and over 500 men are out of work. The matter will be laid before the Stale Railroad Commission.
