ANOTHER READING REPORT.

Said to have Obtained Control of It. Baltimore & Ohio.

PITTSBURGH, Feb. 18.-Private advice have been received by a banker which are regarded as thoroughly reliable, to the effect that the Reading Company has secured absolute control of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad and its numerous branches, and also the New York & New England Railroad.

The terms of the agreement were finally determined by the great financiers who have been negotiating the deal at a conference in Philadelphia, at which all the necessary papers were signed by the contracting parties.

It is the opinion of local financiers that the next announcement will be that it has a trans-continental line to the Pacific.

This latter feature is all the more probable inasmuch as Jay Gould is said to be the secret spring which has put in motion this movement to solidify the great roads of the country.

THE ROOF FELL IN.

Three Men Killed Outright. One Died of His Injuries-Others Hurt.

PLATTSBURGH, N. Y., Feb. 18.-Timbers in the roof of the Arnold ore mine at Ferona, this county, gave way in the morning while the full force of men were at work.

The following men were killed outright: Conrad Dewey, single man; Wm. Nolan, aged 45, married, and father of a large family; Henry Patnow, aged 49, married.

The following were severely wounded: Patrick Dowd, who subsequently died of his injuries, leaving a wife and family; Thomas Russell, who was badly cut on the head, Alexander Dupless, Antoine Lemark.

Oklahoma Republicans.

OKLAHOMA CITY, O. T., Feb. 18.-The Territorial Convention of Republican Clubs met here with 240 delegate present, representing a membership of 10,000. Ledan Guthrie was made chairman and C. E. Horton secretary. T. G. Risley was elected president of the league and E. T. Sadler secretary. Delegates were elected to the National Convention and resolutions were adopted endorsing the administration of President Harrison and particularly commending the appointment of Gov. Seav.

A Real Chicago Aristocrat.

CHICAGO, Feb. 18.-Mrs. John A. Davis, of this city, as the only surviving daughter of Lady Eleanor Stanhove, succeeds to the title of Lady Thrush Stanhove and to Cayon House and the Chantalleu estate. Mrs. Davis is a niece of the late Lord John Russell, of England. Her husband, John A. Davis, is a contestant for the estate of his brother, the late A. J. Davis, who died in Butte, Mont., leaving property valued at several millions of dollars.

Will Send Them to Paraguay.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.-As the people of the Argentine Republic regard with great disfavor the large immigration of Jews into their country, under the auspices of Baron Hirsch, the latter is now endeavoring to divert immigration of his countrymen to Paraguay where he has obtained a large tract of agricultural land.

Racing Accident.

ST. LOUIS, Feb. 18.-Jockey Murkett, while riding Morrilstown on a practice gallop at the race track here, collided with another horse, Murkett and Morrilstown being thrown heavily to the ground. Murkett was seriously injured and Morrilstown had one of his legs broken and had to be shot.

Will be Sentenced Saturday.

ASBURY PARK, N. J., Feb. 18.-Counsel for Louis Aubertin, alias Louis Harriott, convicted murderer of Mrs. Charles Leonard, of the Atlantic Highlands, has prepared papers on the motion for a new trial. Harriott will be sentenced Saturday. He is kept closely guarded night and day.

Gov. Ladd's Proclamation.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Feb. 18.-In response to the appeal of the Russian Famile Relief Committee, Governor Ladd has issued a proclamation recommending prompt action by the people of the State in forwarding their contributions for the starving Russians.

Favor Free Delivery of Mails.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.-The legislative committee of the National Grange of Patrons of Husbandry will be heard tomorrow by the House Committee on Postoffice and Post Roads in favor of free delivery of mails in the country districts.

Morris Glick's Fate.

SCRANTON, Pa., Feb. 18.-Morris Glick, a pack peddler who has "been out" six weeks in the country, stepped out of the way of a freight train on the Lackawanna Railroad and was struck and killed by a passenger train on the other track.

Looking Up the Law.

NEW YORK, Feb. 18.-A Philadelphia dispatch quoted on Wall street says that Gov. Pattison has written a letter to Attorney-General Hensel calling his attention to the reports of a coal deal, asking him to investigate and report whether there is any law covering such cases.

Tschigorin in the Lead.

HAVANA, Feb. 18.-The nineteenth game of the chess match was won by Tschigorin. The Russian for the first time played a Scotch gambit. The game lasted thirty-two moves. The score is Tschigorin 5, Steinitz 7, drawn 4.

As to the Canal.

OTTAWA, Ont., Feb. 18.-Robert Sedgewick, Deputy Minister of Justice, denies that the treaty of Washington declares the St. Lawrence canal free and open for commerce as well as navigation to the subjects of both countries.

Will Report a Substitute.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.-The House Committee on Militia have decided to report a substitute for the bill of Mr. Cutting, of California, to improve the militia. The substitute will thoroughly revise the old militia laws.

Twenty Contract Laborers Returned.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.-The Treasury inspectors returned twenty contract laborers from New York to different counties in Europe.
