THE BALLOT REFORM LAW. Third Lesson on the New Election Act.

It will be the duty of the County Commissioners to provide in each election district a room large enough to be fitted up with voting shelves and a guard rail. If winning Monday, March 28, and Monday, in ary district, no such room can be rented April 4: John J. Price, John McGrall in ary district, no such room can be rented or otherwise obtained, the commissioners will cause to be constructed a temporary

toom of adequate size to be used as a voting room, provided with heat, light, and with a sufficient number of voting shelves or compartments, at or in which voters may conveniently mark their ballots so that in the marking thereof they may be screened from the observation of others, and a guard rail shall be so constructed and placed, that only such persons as are inside said rail can approach within six feet of the ballot box, and of such voting shelves or compartments. The arrangement must be such that neither the ballot box nor the Watches, Diamonds, Precious voting boothe shall be hidden from view of those just outside the guard rail. The number of such voting shelves or com cal Goods, Banquet, Parlor and partments, shall not be less than one for every fifty names on the assessor's list, but shall not in any case be less than three for with 75 and 250 candle power the voters qualified to vote at such voting

> Each party which has by its primary meeting, caucus, convention or board, sent tion, and each group of citizens which has sent to the proper office a nominating pa-

per, shall be allowed to appoint three electors to act as watchers at each voting place, without expense to the county, one of whom shall be allowed to remain in the

oom outside the enclosed space. Each watcher will be provided with a certificate from the County Commissioners, or if the election he held in a township or borough, from the auditors of the same stating his name, names of the persons wh have appointed him, and the party and policy he represents; and no party or policy shall be represented by more than one watcher in the same voting room at any one time. Watchers shall be required to show their certificates when requested to do so. Until the polls are closed no person shall be allowed in the room outside of

said enclosed space, except these watchers; voters not exceeding ten at any time, who are awaiting their turn to prepare their ballots, and peace officers, when necessary, for the preservation of the peace. No peron when within the voting room shall electioneer or solicit votes for any party or candidate, nor shall any written or printed matter be posted up within the said room except as required by law.
