THE BALLOT REFORM LAW. Third Lesson on the New Election Act.

It will be the duty of the County Commissioners to provide in each election district a room large enough to be fitted up with voting shelves and a guard rail.

Each party which has by its primary meeting, caucus, convention or board, sent to the proper office a certificate of nomination, and each group of citizens, which has sent to the proper office a nominating paper, shall be allowed to appoint three electors to act as watchers at each voting place, without expense to the county.

Each watcher will be provided with a certificate from the County Commissioners, or if the election be held in a township or borough, from the auditors of the same, stating his name, names of the persons who have appointed him, and the party and policy he represents.
