A FIENDISH CRIME

The Terrible Secret of an English Fireplace Discovered.

FIVE PERSONS FOUND MURDERED

Four Had Their Throats Cut and One Was Strangled to Death-

Some Think it Was the Work of "Jack the Ripper," Although the Bodies Are Not Mutilated in the Ripper's Style-The Man's Name is Williams, and He Has Been Arrested in Melbourne, Australia-The Victims Supposed to be itis Wife and Novel Methods Used by Society Women

Loynes, March 17 .- A tragedy unparalleled in the history of British crime came to light yesterday through a most singular chain of circumstances. July last a man of the name of Arthur Williams lived in the Dinham Villa, in Bainbill, a fashionable suburb of Liverpool. Not much seems to be known about the antecedents of Williams. He

He courted Miss Mather, a young woman generally admired for her beauty and other attractions, and recognized as a local bells. They got married and went to Australia, where they were supposed to be living happily. The people of of Rainhill were shocked, a few days ago, by the news from Australia that Williams had been arrested there on a charge of murdering his wife and chil-

As soon as these facts became noised As soon as these tacts became noised about in Rainfill the people called to mind queer suspicious that had been afloat about Williams when he occupied the Diniam Villa. They remembered that one day a woman and two children had visited the villa to see Williams, and tinl witness, in case the Home office from the moment of their entering the should see fit to reopen the case for inplace no one had seen them again. affair caused some remark at the time, but nobody thought of murder, and the matter was dropped with the supposition that the three had gone away without be

ng seen. Now, however, the neighbors began to suspect that there might have been foul play, and they determined to state the facts to the police.

The police concluded that no harm could be done by investigating, and they proceeded to the Dinham Villa yesterday proceeded to the Dinham Villa yesterday and began to dig up beneath the fire-place. They noticed, as they began, signs that the place had been disturbed within a comparatively recent period, and certainly since other work had been done in the interior of the villa.

They hardly expected, hower, to discover anything, and their amazement was great when, after they had removed the outer covering, they came upon the

the outer covering, they came upon the bodies of two children. The body of one child indicated that the little one, when killed, was about 7 years of age, and the other was apparently about 5 years

Both bodies were wrapped in a damask table cloth and both had their throats cot. The remains were in a fair state of preservation, and neighbors who had seen the woman and the two children at once concluded that these were the chil-

The digging then proceeded with greater energy than before, and the searchers soon came upon another body. This, upon being unearthed, was found to be a woman. The throat was also

The police kept digging, while outside the news spread and the excitement grew and thousands rushed to the scene of the tragedies.

A new force of police was called upon and a cordon established around the villa. It was now waning toward even-ing, and the digging proceeded rapidly, for rumor grew on rumor and other re-collections suggested that there were more victims in the sepulchre beneath

the fireplace.

The next body uncarthed was that of a girl of 12 years. Unlike the former vic-tims she had evidently been strangled, and it was evident, also, that her death probably ante-dated that of the woman id two children. The giel's body was and two children. The girl's body was removed and the search kept up. A baby about 1 year old, and with its throat cut was reached next. Even the hardened policemen could

not restrain an exclamation of horror as the tiny and shrunken body was lifted up to view.

The work of concealing the bodies was carried out carefully. After a deep hole had been dug the bodies of the woman and two children were thrown in, and cement was poured upon them. Then the bodies of the two elder children were thrown in and more cement was poured into the hole. Next the flag-stones were laid over the top of the hole and, fluxlly, over all, was applied a layer of six inches of cement, extending over the entire kitchen.

to this hour uo more discoveries have been made. The news has caused almost a frenzy in Liverpool, and the multitude have rushed to the conclusion that Williams must be "dark the Rip-per." There is no known evidence, however, to sustain this theory, as the

however, to sustain this theory, as the victims were not mutilated otherwise than stated above. At least such is the statement of the police.

The people in Rainbuil believe that the woman and two children who disappeared upon visiting the villa, and whose hodies were undoubtedly among those discovered, were a former wife of Williams and their two children, and that Williams had soft them to visit the villa Williams had got them to visit the villa for the purpose of getting rid of them in order that they might not be in the way of his murriage to Miss Mather. This, however, is only an impression based on the circumstances. At the time of the murder of Miss

Mather, the wife with whom he went to Australia, Williams and his wife were in helbourne, and it is there that he is under arrest.

Although Williams' appearance corre-

ESCAPED FROM THE CAMP.

Adironduck Raiterra Employes Held as Prisoners and Ht-Used.

TROY, N. Y., March 17 .- John Kelly and James Lee of Brooklyn, William McCarthy and Michael Kelly of Berger for the benefit of the Ladies' Library Point, N. J., men employed to work on the Adiroudack Railroud, reacted here yesterday, having fled from the construction camp.

To a reporter they told a story of out-rage and suffering in the camp which corroborates previous charges of a like

They say one man who tried to escape from the contractors was frozen to death in the woods, and another was beaten with a club and left to die on the road-

They charge that negro women hired as cooks are sold to men in cump for immoral use and that laborers are robbed of their waget and prevented from leav-ing the camps by guards armed with Winchester rifles.

One of the men who worked 44 days says that when he asked for a settlement his boss brought him out 38.75 in debt to the contractors, and another who worked two months was told he had but \$2.80 coming to him. Most exceptiant prices are charged for the most common articles, and a system of slavery and terrorism prevails.

Great Excitement in Paris by Discovery of Explosives.

POLICE ANONY MOUSLY WARNED

A Pouble Guard Placed Around President Carno.'s House and Public Eucldings-

Further searches of houses of suspected Anarch ists have resulted in the discovery of large quantities of explosives, chemicals for manufacturing more, and several Hotobkiss shells. The police were warned by nine letters
