BHENANDOAH, PA., MAY 5, 1892.
To the President and Members of the Borough

That the Water Company will cancel the judgment obtained in the suit against the Horough, pay the costs of suit and waive its right to claim for water supplied the Borough for fire purposes for the past two years, and give the Borough free water for fire protection; provided, the Horough abandons the proposed new water works, and that an agreement to that effect be entered into. 
