MEASURES FOR RELIEF

Aid Coming In for the Oil Creek Sufferers.

GOV. PATTISON VISITS THE SCENE

Two Hundred Thousand Dollars Necessary for the Immediate Wants of the Afflicted People—At Least a Hundred Dead in Oil City—Three Hundred Families Homeless at Titusville—President Harrison Sends a Contribution.

OIL CITY, Pa., June 8.—Gov. Pattison's reception yesterday amounted almost to an ovation. The Governor's manifest personal interest in the sorrowful condition of the people and city has attracted much attention and favorable comment.

The Governor is greatly pleased with the ability the citizens have displayed in dealing with their great calamity. He will return to Harrisburg to-day fully satisfied that everything will be properly managed.

Only three bodies were found yesterday. Three or four of the injured have died. Mayor Hunt feels certain that the list of dead will number at least 100. Forty-two of the bodies recovered have been fully identified.

Every effort is making in the stricken town to conduct the work of recovery with the utmost promptitude. All business is suspended and citizens and city officials alike are devoting all their energies to the aid work.

Food and clothing are constantly distributed in large quantities. The one thing needed above all others now is money to carry on this work. Several hundreds of thousands of dollars will certainly be required.

MISSISSIPPI FLOODS.

The River Ten Miles Wide at Burlington. Brighter Outlook at St. Louis.

BURLINGTON, Iowa, June 8.—The Mississippi river has risen nearly a foot in 24 hours. Should a heavy wind come up the expanse of water now flowing before this city would be turned into an ocean of breakers which would dash many buildings and other property to pieces.

Travel has been suspended on the roads leading north from Burlington on account of the high water. The river is fully ten miles wide at this point, the Illinois side being inundated clear back to the bluffs.

St. Louis, June 8.—The worst of the flood seems to be over. It is now generally thought that the river will go very little higher, even with the addition of the snow water now coming down the Missouri.

This second rise has done but little damage to business on the river front. Everybody has been prepared for this was coming. The railroads on this side and in East St. Louis have so protected their tracks that traffic is unimpeded.

Large Quantities of Lava Issuing from the Crater. NAPLES, June 8.—The eruption of Mt. Vesuvius, which has been noticeable for some time past, is now greatly increased in violence.

Lava in large quantities is issuing from the crater and flowing down the Atro Cavallo ravine. At noon yesterday an earthquake shock was felt in the town of San Severo. The motion was undulatory. For a time the residents were panic-stricken, but upon seeing that no damage had been done and that the disturbance had ceased order was quickly restored.

Was an Important Witness. CAMDEN, N. J., June 8.—The death of Dr. Henry F. Funnell of Philadelphia will deprive the State of a most important witness in the second Lingco murder trial as deceased made the chemical examination of Lingco's garments, by which, as he testified, he found blood stains. If the defense should not consent to the introduction of this testimony in writing it will probably materially influence the trial.
