HOW DO THEY FIGURE?

The last duplicate (1891) of the Shenandoah Water and Gas Company amounted to but \$21,002.50. From this sum must be deducted \$1,049.05 exonerations and \$621 for water supplied the fire plugs, and that will leave a net duplicate of \$19,332,45. Now if the water company, with no competition, can, only show a dupli- PUBLIC NOTICE. cate for that amount, how can the joint committee expect a revenue of \$30,000 annually?

REFERRING to the water company's plant the members of the joint committee say in their circular:

"We are willing to recommend a fair price for it, making due allow ances for the inadequicy of the present pipe system and water supply in proportion to the size of the town, its population and value of its property; also the prospective destruction of the present reservoirs at no distant day by the mining operations soon to be commenced under them. We make this statement that the public may not be misled by any purchased or prejudiced adsrepresentations of the committee's feelings on the question or their duty to the people."

Let the taxpayers read the above quotation carefully. It places the joint committee on record as being willing to recommend a price to be paid by the borough for a plant which they say is doomed to destruction at no distant day. Mark it well.
