VETERANS MEET AGAIN.

Annual Reunion Army of the Potomac Society at Scranton. SCRANTON, Pa., June 16.—The city is full of veterans in attendance at the annual reunion of the Army of the Potomac Society, which began yesterday.

Among the notable veterans present are Gen. F. E. Pinto, one of the few surviving officers of the Mexican War, and Gen. S. E. Chamberlain, who also did duty in both the Mexican War and the Rebellion.
