FROM SEED PATCH TO SMOKE.

The Process of Cultivating and Curing Tobacco. Few persons know the trouble in raising tobacco, and that work never ceases from the time its seed is sown until the smoker or chewer disposes of the leaf.

The ground is next prepared in the field for transplanting the plant, and when the season arrives, hills about three feet apart are made, and the planter then awaits a rain to set out his plants.

When the tobacco plant is ripe, that fact is settled by pressing the leaves together. If they snap and the leaves split it is ready to cut.
