#### LOVELY LAKESIDE.

The Great Summer and Health Resort Opened Yesterday.

The second summer season at Lakeside was formally opened yesterday by the Philopatrian Club of town. The members of the club and their lady friends filled a special train of six cars last evening and returned here at an early hour this morning after having a most delightful time. The immense dancing pavilion was brilliantly illuminated and entrancing dancing music was furnished by an excellent orchestra. The gathering was a brilliant one and all sang praises for the splendid opportunities afforded for genuine enjoyment at Lakeside. Caterer Yost served an excellent supper in first class style.

Lakeside will be the favorite resort of residents of this and surrounding counties. The management of the park has greatly improved the place and is steadily putting money into it to meet the demands of the pleasure seeking public.

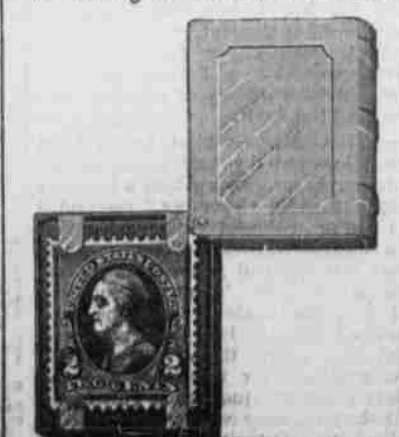
The new depot of the Reading Company is rapidly nearing completion. The structure will be a great improvement on the old one.
