CHEAP TRIP TO NEW YORK.

Low Fares, via Reading Railroad, to the Christian Endeavor Convention.

The Eleventh Annual International Convention of the Christian Endeavor Societies will meet in New York City July 7th to 10th, and will be a monster gathering of christian workers from all over the globe. The Reading Railroad will sell special excursion tickets to New York on July 6th, 6th and 7th at the temptingly low rate of a single fare for the round trip. These will be good to return until July 15th, and upon compliance with certain conditions, they will be extended until August 15th. This not only places attendance upon the convention within the reach of everybody interested in its objects, but it affords an unprecedented opportunity for everybody else to visit New York City. Arrangements for the Grand Gathering at Lakeside.

NEWS OF THE DAY.

Three more Anarchists have been arrested in Paris. Pitcher Mullane has been released by the Cincinnati. Fifteen hay laden barks have been burned in the Neva. The President has signed the Agricultural Appropriation bill. Senor Martinez del Campo, Mexican charge d'affaires at London, is dead. The French Senate and Chamber of Deputies will meet again on the 12th of July.

Gen. J. C. Keltou, retired, has been appointed Governor of the Soldiers' Home in Washington.

There was no change in the condition of Cyrus W. Field last night. He was still very low at that time.

In secret session the Senate confirmed the nomination of William Kapus, of Oregon, to be Consul at Sydney, N. S. W.

The President has approved the bill appropriating \$50,000 for the erection of a statue to the late Gen. W. T. Sherman in Washington.

The Arapahoe Indians are doing the ghost dance on their reservation in the Indian Territory to the great alarm of the white settlers near by.

Three workmen were injured at the Wilder Iron Works, Stockport, England, by the explosion of a cannon being fired to celebrate the elections.

It is reported that a secret convention has been signed by England, Spain and Italy for the partition of Morocco. Definite advices are not at hand.

The Peary Relief Expedition sailed from St. John, N. F., yesterday on the steamship Kite. All the members of the expedition were in capital spirits.

An effort to unite the Democratic and People's parties in Iowa is being made. The scheme is to give the State ticket to the Democrats and the Electoral ticket to the People's party.

Matthias Hadelt, convicted at the Drome Assizes at Valence of the murder of Father Idefonse, Procurator of the Trappist Monastery at Aiguebelle, was yesterday executed by the guillotine.
