WASHINGTON, Aug. 16.-Acting Secre tary Spaulding of the Treasury Department has addressed a letter to the Collector of Customs at New York informing him that he is advised by the Secretary of State that the statue of Columbus will reach the port of New York at the end of this month on the Italian naval transport Garigliano, and requests that the statue be admitted free of duty and that all proper courtesy may be shown to the vessel, her crew and officers. Mr. Spaulding instructs the Collector

to carry out these requests.

#### Well-Poisoner Evans Arrested.




