THE CLUBS AT BUFFALO Hon. Whitelaw Reid in Attendance To-Day.

A MONSTER PARADE THIS EVENING Gen. Clarkson Will Probably Be Re-elected President of the League—The Big Mass Meeting Last Night Addressed By Gov. McKinley and Others.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Sep. 15.—The attendance at the National Republican League of Clubs was much larger this morning when it was called to order than yesterday.

Everybody says Gen. Clarkson is to be re-elected President and A. B. Humphrey Secretary. There is no suggestion of a name in opposition to Clarkson.

The selection of Louisville as the place for holding the next convention gives general satisfaction. The other cities that desired to entertain the League were Cleveland, Chicago and Denver.

The mass meeting last night drew a big crowd to Music Hall. Mr. Clarkson introduced Hon. S. P. Deliver of Iowa, who spoke briefly.

Gov. McKinley said in part: "The issues this year which are to be settled by the suffrages of the people, are made by the national platforms of the Republican and Democratic parties."

First, its universal adherence to free trade. It is by far the boldest declaration in favor of free-trade ever made by any political party in the United States.

"Second, it declares for the abolition of the tax upon State banks of issue. This tax was imposed by Congress to destroy the banks, that they might adopt a national money."

Gov. McKinley devoted considerable time to reviewing the workings of the tariff law, and to statements regarding the tin-plate industry.

COLUMBIAN PORTS CLOSED. Rigid Quarantine Established Against Vessels from New York. PANAMA, Sep. 15.—In consequence of the outbreak of cholera in New York, all Columbian ports will be closed against vessels hereafter sailing from that city.

Barling Brothers' Liabilities. LONDON, Sep. 16.—At a meeting of the directors of the Bank of England, Governor Liddellard announced that the liabilities of Barling Brothers were now \$1,118,613 pounds, as compared with 7,017,055 in March last.

A warrant is out for George Davies, a leading merchant of Cleveland, O. Davies has left for parts unknown and his creditors are in the lurch to the extent of about \$100,000.
