Col. M. P. Fowler is always interesting company, as his fund of information never gets down to a low point. When in Denver several weeks ago he met Ed. Shindler, formerly of Tamaqua, and who was one of the pioneers of the Pike's Peak gold hunters.

Mr. Fowler also met Detective McParlan while in Denver and was treated royally by him. McParlan inquired as to the welfare of many Schuykill county boys.

In 1861 Col. Fowler, in company with his cousin, N. D. Fowler, and two others, visited Washington. In ordering dinner the Colonel called for chicken.

At the inauguration of Lincoln on March 4th, 1861, the spokesman of the New York Republican delegation asked Andrew Johnson, the newly elected Vice President, his opinion of James Buchanan.

Before the war Col. Fowler was captain of one of the best cavalry companies in the state, connected with the militia. It comprised some of the leading citizens of Tamaqua.

Fire Alarm Boxes.

The following list shows the location of the alarm boxes of the Shenandoah Fire Department:

- 15-Coal and Bowers streets. 16-Bowers and Centre streets. 21-Bridge and Centre streets. 25-Main and Centre streets. 34-Main and Poplar streets. 35-Main and Coal streets. 42-Gilbert and Centre streets. 43-Gilbert and Cherry streets. 62-Chestnut and Coal streets.

To send an alarm open the box, pull down the hook once and let go. When an alarm is sent in the fire bell will sound the number of the box and repeat the alarm four times.

HOW TO LOCATE ALARMS. If the alarm is sounded from box 15 the fire bell will strike one, then pause and strike five which will indicate that the fire is in the vicinity of No. 15 box. Every alarm is repeated four times.
