OBE'S OBSERVATIONS.

What He Sees and Hears During His Travels.

"Will the work on the new water works go ahead?" is a question that has been repeatedly asked since Council awarded the contract to Quinn & Kerns. The question has been put to me and I am free to say that the indications are that the work will go ahead. The contract to be made will be a conditional one, conditional in this respect: that should the borough be permanently restrained from proceeding with the project, through no cause of its own, the contractors are not to call upon the borough for damages for breach of contract. Messrs. Quinn & Kerns seem content with the condition and have hinted that they will proceed with the work as soon as the contract is signed and sealed. And Mr. Quinn has intimated that pending and prospective suits have no terrors for him. "Why," said he the other day, "Mr. Heber tells me that he now has a contract under the same terms and there are eight suits pending."

Is there not some way by which the street paving question can be brought to some definite conclusion. The people were in hopes that the matter would be settled before this. If it drags much longer a season of cold weather may arrive and check the work until spring.

With all due respect to the Chief Burgess, I most respectfully insist that nothing short of a Board of Health will serve this town's sanitary interests as they should be attended to. The Burgess cannot do all the work required himself and he has admitted that the members of the sanitary committee has business connections which will not allow them to give the time required for the work. There is no denying the fact that we have an epidemic of diphtheria and scarlet fever in town, two of the most terrible of contagious diseases, and to cope with it successfully we must have a Board of Health.

Several prominent mine officials stood at the Pennsylvania station the other morning and saw women and children struggling over the railroad trestle near the depot carrying upon their backs large bags of coal they had picked from the dirt banks. The scene called forth many remarks from the observers some which were couched in terms of pity. David W. Price, superintendent of the Ashland district, enlightened the other members of the group by stating that Ashland has no such scenes. "The nearest Hungarian settlement to our place," he said, "is at Big Mine Run."

I am informed that Ashland on Saturday was put on a twelve-hour supply of water. One of the gentlemen connected with the water works at that place told me that but little water had been saved by the two-hour rule. "You see," said he, "when people know that the water would be cut off they would fill all the tubs, barrels and pails they could lay hands on. They generally laid in a supply that would last two days with ordinary use and would have a large supply on hand when the water would be turned on; then they throw away the stale water and the waste was as great as before."

I notice in one of our Ashland exchanges an amusing story told of a small boy of that place. He had been visiting at Shenandoah, and there, for the first time, saw Uncle Sam's gray uniformed letter carriers. He came home ambitious to become a letter carrier himself, and secretly secured a bundle of old love letters that his mother had treasured since courtship days, and distributed them from house to house through the neighborhood. The sequel is not related, but the probability is that this bright youth has no further aspirations in the letter line.

The following list shows the location of the alarm boxes of the Shenandoah Fire Department:

LOCATION.
15—Coal and Bowers streets.
16—Bowers and Centre streets.
24—Bridge and Centre streets.
25—Main and Centre streets.
34—Main and Poplar streets.
35—Main and Coal streets.
42—Gilbert and Centre streets.
43—Gilbert and Cherry streets.
52—Chestnut and Coal streets.

To send an alarm open the box, pull down the hook once and let go. When an alarm is sent in the fire bell will sound the number of the box and repeat the alarm four times.

HOW TO LOCATE ALARMS.
If the alarm is sounded from box 15 the fire bell will strike one, then pause and strike five which will indicate that the fire is in the vicinity of No. 15 box. Every alarm is repeated four times.
