It is now in order to say how it all happened.

The cry now will be "Turn the screws out."

If yesterday was Republican weather the party will want some other kind hereafter to win.

Everything has an end, so this canvass has. Let us give thanks that we can think, talk and write about something else than politics.

Now that the election is over it behooves all to get down to business and make up for lost time. Let animosities brought about by political discussions be forgotten and let all act as neighbors should. That is the American way.

The naval review to be held at Hampton Roads next April will be one of the grandest sights ever seen in our waters and will draw thousands from all over the country and from foreign shores to Old Point and Norfolk, Va. Congress appropriated \$50,000 to help defray the expenses.

In 1890 the people of this country drank 1,661,192 gallons of costly foreign brandies, gins and cordials. A low cost average on this would be \$3 a gallon, or \$7,805,990. They drank 5,060,873 gallons of costly champagnes and other foreign wines. A low average on this would be \$10 a gallon, or \$50,608,730 for the lot. They drank 2,716,661 gallons of imported malt liquors. A low average for this would be \$1.50 a gallon, or \$4,074,991 for the lot. This makes a total of \$92,489,791 expended for foreign drinks alone, besides the immensely greater bill for domestic liquors. The expenditures for imported liquors would put 624,893 pensioners on the roll at \$8 per month.

EVIDENTLY one of the chairmen of the two National committees was egregiously mistaken in his calculations in regard to the result of the election, or he has been engaged in wilfully and deliberately deceiving his friends. Mr. Carter's and Mr. Harrity's official opinions in regard to the political situation generally, and in regard to political states, were accepted by the parties respectively represented by those two high officials as authoritative, and on these opinions were based nearly all of the wagers that have been laid on the result. It is possible that either or both of the chairmen may have believed what they had officially stated, and if such be the case there is no getting away from the fact that they have been too credulous. One thing is evident that the opinions of the two men, as expressed in their bulletins, could hardly be wider apart. States that were confessedly doubtful were classed by each as dead sure for the party he represented, and by a majority so large as to cause a feeling of incredulity. When the returns told the story of the voting, those who wagered their thousands have lost, visit their wrath upon the men who have either wilfully or ignorantly misled them.

It may be interesting to know. That when excursion rates are made to Chicago for people who live in the East to enable them to attend the World's Fair next year, it is contemplated by the Western roads to also make excursion rates from Chicago to all principal business and tourist points in the West, Northwest and Southwest, so that those who desire to spend a few weeks among their friends in the Great West may have an opportunity of so doing without incurring much additional expense. Illinois.

CHICAGO, Nov. 9.—The registration of the city was 279,000, and the problem was how the 100,000 new electors would vote. Cook county has gone for Cleveland by 20,000 plurality. The result in the State shows that the Democrats have won.

A Buffalo Voter Drops Dead.

BUFFALO, Nov. 9.—The first arrests of the day were made in the fifth district of the 19th ward, where eight men were gathered in by United States marshals for illegal registration before they had an opportunity to vote. No interference was offered to their arrest. They were taken before Commissioner Hirschback, pleaded not guilty and bail in \$1,000 each was furnished. Robert Klenow, a voter, dropped dead in the fifth district of this ward shortly after 8 o'clock. He had just reached the door of the booth when he threw up his hands and fell to the ground. When picked up he was a corpse. His death resulted from heart disease.

Michigan.

DETROIT, Nov. 9.—Latest returns indicate that Cleveland will have seven, and possibly eight of the Presidential electors from Michigan. The election of Morse (Dem.) as Governor is claimed, and the chances are that the Democrats have secured a majority of the Legislature, which chooses a successor to Senator Stockbridge (Rep.) Michigan has given a first trial to the new system of choosing Presidential electors by Congressional districts and the Democrats have gained more electors than they anticipated.
