SUNDAY SERMON.

Rev. Powick's Discourse Sunday Before the M. E. Congregation.

Thesermon in the M. E. church on Sunday morning was on "The strength of weakness," for XII-10 "When I am weak then am I stong." The weakness of which Paul spoke past week, left yesterday. was not physical for this has nothing to do with human goodness nor greatness. It scald not have been mental weakness for the strength of his logic and the beauty of his chetoric forbid the thought. Nor was it moral or spiritual, for the moral grandeur of his life and the pure spirituality of his writings attest the contrary. Nor can it be that he is applied to him. What then does the herole Paul mean when he speaks of his weakness? "Who is weak and I am not weak." "When I am work then am I strong:

The weakness of which he speaks was the feeling which resulted from several things, chief of which was his long continued reflection upon the desparate condition of the world as he know it and its terrible doom as he learned it :- its estrangement from God, its abaminable wickedness, its filtby practices, damnable heresies, hellish allurements. He Frackville, saw that "the world lieth in the wicked one" and that men were rushing to hell as flat as their vices could drive them. Then there was his profound conviction of personal responsibility for the spread of the Gospel and the uplifting of men to God. He felt that he was his brothers keeper.

He was seized with the conviction "woe is me if I preach not the Gospel"-not an emascultaed Gospel but "the whole counsel of God." He felt, moreover, that he must preach it not only in season but out of season. There was so much to be done and so few engaged in doing it and so many engaged in hindering it that the cry is extorted "who is sufficient for these things." The angry mob drives him from Antioch, he flees from flying missles at Iconium, is dragged for dead from Lystra, is imprisoned at Philippi, ridiculed and arrested at Athens, and is beaten in his father's house at Jerusalem-no wonder he felt weak. But it was such weakness as only a master mind can feel after realizing the overwhelming magnitude of the work, the tremendous responsibility under which he lives and the imadequacy of his own mative resourcesit takes a moral gigant to feel such weakness. Let us not suppose that it was like much of weakness that we hear of now and which resalts from spiritual leanness and downright stothfulness. 




