The two teachers who receive the greatest number of total votes up to the closing hour above stated will be declared the winners. All coupons must be cut out of the EVENING HERALD and sent, securely sealed in envelopes, addressed to "Contest Editor, Evening Herald, Shenandoah, Pa." Any person residing in any place may vote as often as he or she may desire for one or more teachers engaged in teaching in a public school north of the Broad Mountain at the close of the current school term; provided, that any teacher who may have been unaccountably or wilfully absent from teaching for a period of not more than three months prior to the end of the term, may also compete. Each vote for each teacher must be represented by a separate coupon. A coupon bearing the name of more than one teacher or specifying more than one vote for a teacher will be thrown out as void. Each coupon will have the date of its issue at the lower left hand corner, and such coupons must be in the hands of the Contest Editor within ten days after the date it bears. A careful record will be kept of the names of all contestants, and all coupons will be filed and kept safe until the final adjudication.
