NAMED FOR SENATORS.

Elections and Nominations in Several States.

ALBANY, Jan. 18.—A number of spectators, including several of the heads of departments, were assembled in the chamber when the Senate was called to order after the morning recess.

The Lieutenant-Governor announced that in accordance with the United States Statutes the Senate would proceed to ballot for Senator. Each Senator was in his place and named his choice as his name was called.

The result was as follows: Total votes cast, 30; for Edward Murphy, Jr., 17; for Frank Hiseock, 12; for Whitelaw Reid, 1.

The vote was a party vote with the exception of Senator Edwards who, in voting for Mr. Reid, said:

"It is sometimes agreeable to waive personal preferences in deference to the views of others; but in this case I see no reason for doing so. I intend to cast my vote in the manner that will, for me, best answer the question: 'Who is the fittest man to represent the State in the United States Senate?' I therefore cast my vote for that eminent diplomatist and distinguished journalist, the Hon. Whitelaw Reid."

The election of United States Senator drew a large audience to the Assembly chamber.

A resolution declaring that the best interests of this State require the early repeal or suspension of the act authorizing the monthly purchase of silver bullion by the United States, was adopted unanimously.

A recess of fifteen minutes was then taken.

At 12 o'clock the House was called to order. By this time it was crowded. There were only two or three members absent, and the call was suspended without sending for them.

The roll was then called for the vote for United States Senator and each man rose in his seat and named his choice.

When the Speaker formally announced the choice of the House as for Edward Murphy, Jr., 75; for Frank Hiseock, 52; there was general applause from the Democratic side of the House.

The absentees were Messrs. Adams, Denniston and Vandewater, all of whom were excused.

SENATOR FROM CONNECTICUT.

Joseph H. Hawley Chosen by Both Houses To-day.

HARTFORD, Jan. 18.—Both Houses of the General Assembly voted for United States Senator yesterday. In the Senate, which contains 12 Republicans and 12 Democrats, one Senator, Fox, of New Haven, was absent, and paired with Kenney, Rep. The vote was:

Joseph R. Hawley, Rep., 11; Carlos French, Dem., 11.

Lieut.-Gov. Cady, Dem., in the Chair, declared the vote a tie.

In the House 234 votes were cast, with 10 members absent. Hawley received 128, French, 105, Forbes, Pro., 1, and there was one pair.

To-day both houses meet in joint convention, and elect the Senator for six years from March 4.

QUAY NOMINATED.

He Receives 146 Votes in the Republican caucus to Dalzell's 15.

HARRISBURG, Pa., Jan. 18.—The Republican caucus nominated Matthew S. Quay for United States Senator.

The vote was: Quay, 143; Dalzell, 18; Gobin, 1.

The Democratic legislative caucus nominated by acclamation State Senator Geo. Ross of Bucks county for United States Senator.

Collins Nominated at Boston.

BOSTON, Jan. 18.—The Democrats of the Legislature in caucus unanimously nominated P. A. Collins for United States Senator.

The vote was: Collins, 10; Dalzell, 18; Gobin, 1.

The Democratic legislative caucus nominated by acclamation State Senator Geo. Ross of Bucks county for United States Senator.

Hughes' Sentence Affirmed.

ALBANY, Jan. 18.—The Court of Appeals has affirmed the judgment of the lower court in the case of James Hughes, Master Workman of the Cutlers and Trimmers' branch of the K. of L., convicted and sentenced to one year in prison for extortion in taking \$1,000 from a Rochester firm to defray the expense of raising a boycott which had been declared against the firm.

The Muncie Strike.

INDIANAPOLIS, Jan. 18.—The L. E. & W. strike has reached the courts. General Superintendent Hill has filed a petition in the United States Court against Muncie strikers asking for a restraining order to prevent them from interfering or in any way molesting the agents of the company. Judge Baker issued a temporary restraining order, returnable Jan. 25.

Three Speeches in the Senate.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18.—Three prepared speeches were read in the Senate during the morning hours. The first was by Mr. Morrill (Rep. Vermont), against the McGarrath bill; the second by Mr. Miller (Pop. Kansas), in favor of a constitutional amendment limiting the Presidential office to one term, and the third by Mr. Call (Dem., Florida), in defense of the constitutionality of the anti-opium bill.

Being for \$25,000 Damages.

DELSHAM, Mass., Jan. 18.—The executor of the estate of Lewis H. Kingsbury, late president of the Dedham National bank, have brought a suit against Expressman Babcock, of Boston, whose runaway horse knocked Mr. Kingsbury down in Freetown square Dec. 8, 1892, inflicting injuries from which he died. The suit sued for is said to be \$25,000.
