THE KAISER'S 34TH BIRTHDAY.

Brilliant Setes in Berlin in His Honor-More Arrests in Connection With the Baxen Romana Peauds-Judge Franqueville Finds a Bill Against Ferdinand de Lesseps.

Bunseyer, Jan. 28 .- An explosion from a cause still unascertained took place in a coal mine at Tokad, near Gran, yesterday. Fire broke out immediately after the explasion and is still burning.

About 150 men were in the mine at the time of the explesion. The shaft was not impaired and the cage was sent down almost at once.
The bodies of 19 men who had been

killed by the shock were found near the bottom of the shaft and were bought up The cage went down again, but returned immediately, as the smoke was so dense that the rescue party were unable to remain below.

Two of the party were unconscious be-

fore they reached the top. About 130 mon are still in the mine.

LAMAR LAID TO REST. Funeral Services Over the Juriet at

The body lay in state in the front parlor of Mr. Virgin's residence, and hundreds of mourners have visited the house for a glance at the face of the dead jurist.

A profusion of floral decorations were massed about the catafalque, and the remains were enclosed in a magnificent casket. Chief Justice Fuller and Associate Justices Brewer, Shirns, and Gray were

present.

FROM THE OLD WORLD MODENTS OF BLAINE'S CAREER Resignation from the Cabinet-His Literary Aspirations—The Conkling Episode.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—Regarding Mr. Blaine's resignation from President Harrison's Cabinet, concerning which there has been much discussion, an intimate

friend says: "At 12 o'clock of the day Mr. Blaine's "At 13 o'clock of the day Mr. Blaine's resignation was given out he had no idea of resigning from the Cabinet. He had had a meeting on that day with the Canadian Commissioners on the Welland canal question. It was said afterwards that Mr. Blaine had resigned because he and John W. Foster got into a controversy in the presence of the Canadians. This is absolutely fains.

"When Mr. Blaine reached home he found some one had marked a lot of interviews which had been telegraphed."

papers. "They accused Mr. Blaine with betruy ing the President and with using his place in the Cabinet as a cover for a conspiracy to defeat the President and secure th

'Under the heat of indignation over these interviews, Mr. Blaine wrote his resignation, and he has since told his friends that there were never but two oc ensions of difference between nimself and the President, and that they had been fully explained and satisfactorily set-The Coulding Episode.

Mr. Blaine's career in the House was marked by many exciting episodon. He first came into prominence through an angry afterention between himself and

angry afterention between himself and Hoseos Conking, then a member of the House from Utica, N. Y.

It was in the war period, and Blaine made a bitter attack upon Conkling for having charged the Government with fees as a judge-advocate while drawing pay as a member of Congress. Conkling epelled the attack and indulged in som evere criticism of his opponent, who in epiy spoke derisively of Coukling's 'unegnificent turkey gobbler strut.'' The incident excited great public at-ention at the time, and helped to bring

both actors in it into that prominence which they each enjoyed during the remainder of their lives.

Blaine's Literary Aspirations. Immediately after his resignation from the Cabinet of the President last summer Mr. Blaine went to Bar Harbor where he might recuperate his health and at the same time mature those plans about which he had talked in a general vay with his most intimate friends His tastes had always been of a literary character, and his ability in that direc-

sion is evidenced by the scholarly style and polished finish of his "Twenty Years of Congress. It was his intention to have followed this up with a commentary on the politi-cal history of the country since the period covered by his first work, and to


