By the time Washington's second arm had come round things had somewhat changed from what they were four years before. With his customary disposition to steer a middle course when ever a difficult piece of navigation was to be attempted. Washington stretched a little the provisions of section 2, article 2, of the constitution, by requiring the opinion in writing of the heads of departments as to what ceremonies ought to attend the taking of the Presidential oath. Hamilton and Knox were for a tolerably stiff ceremonial, and so were Vice-President Adams and Attorney-General Randolph, but Jefferson. nev-General Randolph, but Jefferson, while advising the taking of the oath in the presence of the Senate, as being a the presence of the Senate, as being a part of the executive power, suggested that it be done with brief and plain formality. Washington, having a soft place in his heart for "pomp and eircumstances" (as witness the spectacular resignation of his commission at the close of the war), and finding such good support as named above, came out in a grand suit of black velvet, with dress grand suit of black velvet, with dress word, chapeau-bras and powdered hair sword, chapean-bras and powdered hair. Besides the two houses of Congress there were present the glittering diplomats and the searlet robed judges of the Supreme Court. Then came the going in state to church, escorted by guards of honor, followed by the two houses, riding in an open charlot, and so hearing distributions.


