All of the earlier branches of nominations those of ex Senators Eastle and Hampton made in the morning, were confirmed without the formality of a reference to the appropriate committees. When the reports of the various committees were made, all of them favorable, there was not a word of dissent and the utmost harmony prevailed, so far as any word of opposition was concerned, at least. The nominations were confirmed in the ordinary way, without a vote, there being no objections of-
