

PREPARING FOR THE ODD FELLOWS.

Reading Will Entertain the Visitors in Grand Style.

Reading, April 28.—The local committee in charge of the grand lodge, I. O. O. F. of Pennsylvania, which meets here May 16, is making extensive preparations for the event.

There will be no parade as was supposed by many to be a feature. This session will be devoted very closely to the transaction of business and for that reason no display will take place.

Provisions for 1,000 has been made at the hotels and the committee has had a vast amount of work to secure quarters. The balance has been provided for at private boarding houses and the gathering promises to be one of the largest of the kind held in Reading for years.

The grand lodge convention will open Tuesday morning May 16, in the Academy of Music, and will in all probability remain in session until Friday.

The extended session will be caused by the revision of the constitution of subordinate lodges which is of great importance. The various committees and reports of officers and different projects will also receive full and complete consideration.

On Monday evening, May 15, the grand encampment, which is one of the higher degrees in the order, will meet in annual convention in I. O. O. F. hall, Eighth and Fifth streets. The election of officers and various matters of interest will occupy the attention of the assembly and degrees will also be conferred on quite a number of candidates.
