ALL AROUND THE STATE. News from all Sections of the Commonwealth. HAPPENINGS IN MANY LOCALITIES.

The Last of the Three Tax Cases Against the City of Philadelphia Decided in Favor of the State—A Wreck on the Pennsylvania at Glen Manor—John W. Menteer Refused a New Trial.

GETTYSBURG, April 29.—A distinguished party of civil and military men were here last night. The principal members are General D. O. Howard, United States Army; General James Easton, the surviving ranking officer of the Confederate Army; and his old General Loring and his old General Alexander.

LANCASTER, April 29.—The news expressed a new trial to John W. Menteer, convicted of embezzling \$1,000 from the state for fees paid to him as tax on wine while he was prothonotary. He made no defense before the jury, but relied on technicality for acquittal. He has failed in business, is unable to raise the money, and unless the supreme court intervenes he will be sent to the prison as a convict over which he was keeper for several years.

BRADY GETS A GOOD JOB. HARRISBURG, April 29.—John Gay, of Cory, representing the Pennsylvania state fish commission at the World's Columbian Exposition, has appointed Alonzo E. Brady, of this city, assistant sergeant at arms of the house of representatives, to a responsible position in the fisheries building. Mr. Brady will report for duty at Chicago next week.

MARK SELLS HIS TROTTER. ANNVILLE, April 29.—Henry F. Mark, of this city, has sold his bay trotting horse to Albert and Charles Cummings, of Harrisburg. The animal has a good record, and was purchased by Mr. Mark from Dr. Ewer, of Myerstown.
