It Is Flung to the Breeze at the Great Exposition.

CHEERED BY SOVEREIGNS. A Patriotic Demonstration Without a Parallel.

AMERICANS RENEW ALLEGIANCE. Over Two Hundred Thousand People Greet the First American Flag with a Pledge of Loyalty and a Burst of Song.

A Remarkable Rendition of the "Star Spangled Banner"—The New Liberty Bell Sounds Its First Message of Freedom to the World.

CHICAGO, July 5.—All Chicago, and especially the fair was alive with patriotism yesterday. It was the center from which the patriotic pulse of a liberty loving people radiated.

Chicago's 3,000,000 of permanent population kept the holiday uproariously, and 500,000 strangers from outside the city, far and near, helped to celebrate.

Thousands of people who originally intended to enter the fair grounds by Stony Island avenue gates were so entranced by the unparalied sight, which met their eyes on reaching the park, that they were unable to do so.

KILLED BY FIRE DAMP.

Another Terrible Fatality in an English Colliery.

OVER A HUNDRED WORKMEN DEAD. Rescuing Parties Tied the Unfortunate Victims Lying in Heaps, and Are Finally Compelled to Abandon the Work of Rescuing Bodies.

LONDON, July 5.—A great mining fatality occurred yesterday in a colliery at Thorn Hill, Yorkshire. The cause was an explosion of fire and the heavy roof fell throughout the settlement, which is inhabited almost exclusively by the miners and their families.

The scenes usual at the pit mouth in the case of mining accidents are being repeated in Thornhill, and considerable trouble is experienced in keeping those having relatives or friends in the mine from interfering with the work of the rescuers.

The pit managers organized an exploration party and descended slowly through the smoke. They were driven back repeatedly and eventually gave up their purpose of penetrating to the working before the foul gas could be cleared away.

Two Killed by Lightning. KANSAS CITY, July 5.—While standing under a tree ten miles south of the city Irving Clark, aged 15, and Frank Paulin, aged 13, both from this city, were struck by lightning and both instantly killed.

Master Workman Hughes Free. ROCHESTER, N. Y., July 5.—Master Workman James Hughes, after serving six months of the sentence imposed upon him for conspiracy, was released from the Monroe county penitentiary this morning.
