A MONSTER CYCLONE.

CHENOQUET, Ia., July 7.—A destructive cyclone passed through the south part of this (Cerro) county last evening, cutting a path of ruin from a quarter to three miles in width and extending some twelve miles in the county. Reports of fourteen deaths and a large number of injured have already been brought to this city. The path of the storm is marked by complete desolation. Houses, barns and fences were swept completely away. Crops are ruined and a large number of farm animals killed. Details are very meager.

PROMINENTS AT THE FAIR.

The Secretary of the Treasury to Enjoy a Week of Sightseeing. CHICAGO, July 7.—The secretary of the treasury and Mrs. J. G. Carlisle, their young son, Henry, of Kentucky, and Colonel C. O. Stead, were on the ground yesterday, in charge of the secretary's son, W. H. Carlisle, who is attorney for the exposition. The party came out on the revenue cutter Andy Johnson.

Other Distinguished Visitors were the Governor of Utah, Gen. W. West, Governor Pattison, of Pennsylvania, and Secretary of State William H. Taft.

A Brave Soldier's Presence of Mind.

MALTA, July 7.—The saving of the warship Campervilla, which collided with the Victoria, is said to have been due to the presence of mind shown by a Maltese stoker. Although off duty at the time of the collision he voluntarily ran below and closed the water-tight doors. Before he had completed the task the water was up to his neck. The admiralty will promote the stoker and grant him a life pension in case this story of his coolness and bravery be confirmed.

Farley's "Respects" to Irby.

COLUMBIA, S. C., July 7.—Hugh L. Farley, adjutant and inspector general of South Carolina under the reform regime, has written an open letter to J. L. M. Irby, junior senator from this state, denouncing him in very severe terms. Farley charges the senator with maligning and misrepresenting him. He calls the senator the champion liar of South Carolina and concludes his letter by stigmatising him as a low mouthed, vulgar bully and braggart.

The Indians to Have a New Trial.

WILMINGTON, L. T., July 7.—The Choctaw Indians sentenced to be shot for the murder of the late Senator, were given a new trial. The court will not suffer execution of the sentence, which was set for today. The courts have ordered a reprieve for a month, to give the prisoners an opportunity to have a new trial.

Honors to Social Democrats.

BIRMINGHAM, July 7.—Eugene Bauer, a prominent socialist, was made chairman of a social committee in the reichstag, and Paul Singer, a Social Democrat leader, was made chairman of another committee. This is the first time in the reichstag's history that such honors have been bestowed on Social Democrats.

Christian Philosophers in Session.

NEW BRITAIN, Conn., July 7.—The American Institute of Christian Philosophy, which has among its membership some of the most eminent public men, clergymen and scientists of the day, began its seventeenth summer session at the Auditorium at Prohibition park, yesterday afternoon.

An Italian Exhibitor Arrested.

CHICAGO, July 7.—Giovanni Dacchini, an exhibitor at the World's Fair, was taken to the federal grand jury by United States Commissioner Hoyle in bonds of \$10,000. He was arrested in the Italian section of the Manufacturers' building, charged with selling goods in bond.
