One who was addleted to his cups might recognize in the resture merely the figment of an al collored brain, and an artist regar him as the prototype of one of those uncanny monsters which sprawl upor door of St Anthony's cave in Ten lers blaarre pictures of the temptation of that holy character. Our earliest and, in fact, almost our sole account of the platypus are commed to baid and literal downlotions of his appear-ance and habitat, from which we learn

he is confined to Tasmania and the southern districts of Australia; and although his race has been thought t embrace two or three species, it is now generally agreed to consist of only one You may repair many times to the favorite baunt of the platypus before you see him, and to discover the re-

treat to which he modestly ratires o observing your presence is a task imther than a black follow. To these ounning hunters, however, there are no secrets of beast or bird; their un erring instituet tells them when the platypus, diving near the edge of the stream, is in quest of food, or when he is socking the submerged entrance to his burrow; and they will advise you ither where to point your gun in exsectation of the animal's reappearance ir where to dig in the bank in con fidence of striking the grass-lined nes wherein he dwells and rears his remarkable family.

WHEN THE MOON IS FULL. It Is an Wvent of Rare Astronomical Oc-

currence. Did you ever see a "full moon?" asks a writer in the St. Louis Republic. I know what your answer will be without waiting for it. It is this: ⁴⁴Yes once every month since I have been old enough to pay attention to such phenomena." Yet I take the position that you are badly mistaken, and that in all probability you have never in your life beheld the full face of our "silvery sister world." By way of solution lei us see what it takes to consti tute a 'full moon' in the exact sense o the term. A full moon occurs only when our obsequicus attendant is one hundred and eigh 'y degrees of longi-tude from the sun, Old Sol and the earth being in the colliptic. But the moon's orbit is inclined to the colliptic at an angle of five degrees eight min-ntes forty-seven seconds, and is therefore never on the cliptic except when at its "nodes" or crossings. This being the case, what we call

the circular dist of the moon (full moon) lacks considerable of being an exact circle, being what astrono mers term "in a .tate of globosity,' and is never a perfect disk excep hen "a full moon" happens exactly as the time when Luna is crossing the ecliptic, at which time she must necessarily be centrally cellpted. 
