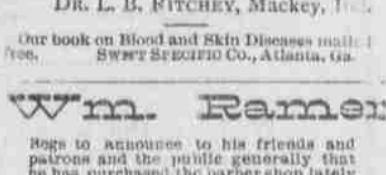

NICARAGUA'S PRESIDENT HERE.

General SANCIA Speaks of the Recent Revolutionary Disturbances.

San Juan, Cal., July 11.—Among the passengers arriving at this port by the Pacific mail steamer 'Olson' was General Roberto SANCIA, of Nicaragua.

In an interview stated that his present visit to the United States is for recreation and instruction merely, and that with his family he intends to spend some time at the World's fair.

With respect to the revolution he said that he had no doubt that many persons had been made upon the minds of Americans, who doubtless in many cases regarded it as a violent act of dictatorship.

SMITH DOWNS GRIFFIN.

The Pacific Coast Champion Wins in Four Rounds.

JACKSON AND CORBETT MATCHED. The Champion Pugilist and Parson Davies Post a Forfeit at the Ringide for a Final Fight with the Colored Heavyweight in November Next.

Rory, Ind., July 11.—John Griffin, the "Brain-tree" lad, and Solly Smith, the champion of the Pacific coast, met last night in the arena of the Columbus Athletic club for a purse of \$5,000 and the featherweight championship of the world.

Before the contest began there were loud calls for Corbett, who jumped over the ropes and said: "I want a forfeit," roared Corbett. "Here is another forfeit," shouted the Davies, producing a big roll of bills and handing it to O'Malley.

When this incident had concluded Jimmy Barry, of Chicago, and Pat Shea, of Oregon, appeared in the ring for the ten-round preliminary contest. It took only four rounds for the Chicago boy to settle Shea. It was a slugging match from start to finish.

It was 10:48 when Griffin appeared in the ring, and Smith followed him a moment later. Both men appeared to be in the very pink of condition. Griffin's seconds were Jimmy Carroll, Dan Creedon and Howe, and for Smith, Sam J. Patrick, Joe Choussard and Edward Smith.

Time was called at 10:55. Smith moved wildly, but Griffin caught him with his right and left in the face. Both men exchanged blows. Smith had the advantage as the bell rang.

In the second round Smith started out with a wild rush and Griffin swung, landing on Smith's face, staggering him for the moment, following it with his right and left to the body.

Smith was still groggy when the bell rang for the fourth round, but he came up bravely. Griffin landed in his face with right and left, followed up with a heavy right on the breast and rushed his opponent around the ring. Smith staggered when he reached the center of the arena, and a heavy thrust in the wind knocked him to earth.

It was five minutes before Griffin sufficiently recovered from his knockout so as to be able to walk out of the ring, and when he reached the dressing room he fairly collapsed. Blood was flowing freely from an ugly cut in the lip, and Dr. Davis put in several stitches to close the several wounds.
