

# MR. BLOUNT'S REPORT.

It Is Expected at the National Capitol in a Few Days.

ANNEXATION NOT IMPROBABLE. It Is Belleved the President Will Reaub

mit Ex-President Harrison's Treaty or a Modification Thereof-A New Commissioner Coming.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 20.-The steame Oceanic brings news from Honolulu of the appointment of William D. Alexander as special commissioner to Washington to assist in the negociations for annexation. He will leave Honolulu this week. Mr. Alexander is the leading historian of Hawall, and widely known in scientific circles abroad. He was Hawallan commissioner to the meridan congress in 1884 at Washington. Mr. Alexander will assist Minis-ter Thurston, and both will be left free to yield to the reasonable wishes of the ad-

amistration.

Minister Blount has concluded his re-port on Hawaiian affairs, and it was stated he would probably forward it to Washing-ton by the steamer Australia, which was to all July 19. It is reported that he has given the provisional government to un-derstand that nothing will be done until he sends back his report, which may be acted upon during the extra session of congress in August. The opinion prevails in official circles that after receiving Min-ister Blount's report President Harrison's treaty of annexation, or some modification theroof, to the senate. The new treaty thereof, to the senate. The new treaty mentioned in previous dispatches, which was drawn here to be submitted to the

United States government, will be with-held, awaiting the action on Minister

Blount's report. The latest reports con-cerning the document are that it is a straight treaty of sumexation, without conditions, in which no reference occurs to the labor question, finances or the present System of land holdings. Paul Neumann, lately the queen's agent to Washington, has issued a manifesto in

the form of an open letter to President Dole attributing the hard times and languishing trade to the present political uncertainty, and demanding that the will of the people be ascertained by popular

The situation in the islands is apparently quiet. No conspiracies are known to be in progress unless Neumann's manifesto betokens such. The ministry pos-itively deny having ever received from Mr.

Blount any intimation that Secretary Gresham had disapproved his action in the case of Nordhoff. The ministers speak in high terms of their confidence in Mr. Blount and of their satisfactory relations with him.

The leper murderer Koolan is still at large, but all the others have been captured. On two occasions recently soldiers attacked Koolan's lair in force with disasrous results, Koolan shooting and killing three of them. Their remains were brought back to Hodolulu, where a grand military funeral was given to them on the 16th. The whole town turned out as spectators. A reward of \$1,000 has been o ffered for the

apprehension of Koolan. Minister of Finance Damon has made public a statement which shows that the whites own 971g per cent. of all the busi-ness interests of the islands, while Americans own 70 per cent of the same.

## INDIGNANT CHINAMEN.

Trying to Force the Government Into the Siamese Dispute,

THE BRITISH INTERESTS IN SIAM

Mr Edward Gray, Parlimentary Secretary of the Foreign Office, Declares Tha the French Hlockade Will be an Act of Belligerency - M. Pavie Leaves Baughuk

TIES-Ters, July 25,-The Chinese goverroment has received the news of France's territorial demands upon Siam with territorial demands upon Siam with smazement and indignation. That France should lay claim to country up to the fiventy-third parallel is regarded as an in-trusion upon the rights of Chins, for st Pekin the content is that both banks of the Mekong to a part of the first balance of the Mekong to a part of the set of the twenty third parallel are Crinese posses-sions. The Mandaria party, which is hit-terly anti-French, is trying to force the government to interfers.

PARIS, July 26.—A exbinet connell was beld yesteriny at Marty-Le-Rol, where President Carnot is temporarily sojourn-ing. M. Carnot presided over the delberations, which were entirely devoted to the Siamesa question. After the council rose it was stated that the government had taken such measures to safeguard the interests and dignity of France as were

considered from Siam's reply to the French ultimatum to have been rendered bellesshry.

It is stated semi-officially that the blockade will not be confined to the estuary of the Menam, but that the rivers east and west also will be blockaded. Bear Admiral Humann will occupy an island eighteen rules from the Menam. It is reported also that there is no intention to bombard Baugkok, although the batteries on both sides of the riverat Paknam and on the island in midstream will be destroyed. The Royal Palace, where 12,000 soldiers are believed to be massed, will be attacked and occupied. The Debats, after noting that the region south of the twenty-third parallel, to

which France hopes to extend her territory in Siam, includes the provinces ceded by Great Britain to Siam after the Burmese war, makes these comments: "Tile, we believe, is what the marquis of Dufferin was charged to represent to M. 


