Panis, July 31.-Siam has accepted the Panis, July 31.—Siam has accepted the altimatum of France. Prince Vadhana, Elam's minister in Paris, called early on M. Develle, the French minister of foreign affairs, and informed him that, in view of the wardks measures taken by France, Elam accepted, without reserve or restriction, the ultimatum of July 18, in all its terms—the rectilization of frontier with the left bank of the Mekong as the limit, the left bank of the McKong as the limit, the payment of indemnity, the immediate payment of 3,000,000 francs and the punishment of those gallty of attacks upon persons or property belonging to France.
