New York and New Jersey Bridge Bill Passes the House.

PROVISIONS OF THE MEASURE.

The Structure Must be Commoneed Within Two Years, Must be Completed Within Ten Years Thereafter, and Must be 150 Feet Above Highest Tide.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.-The New York and New Jersey bridge bill, which was passed in the house of representatives, authorizes the New York and New Jersey bridge companies, incorporated by the states of New York and New Jersey to construct a bridge series the Hudson river between New York city and the state of New Jersey, subject to the laws of said

The location of the bridge shall be sub ject to approval by the secretary of war; i shall not be tocated below Sixty-sixt street, New York; the company must la railroad tracks which may be used by a railroad on either side to connect the tracks; all railroad approaches on the New York aids must be approved by the commissioners of the sinking fund of that city It must be not less than 150 feet from the water at the highest ride; tolls must be controlled by the laws of New York and

The plans of construction must be approved by the secretary of war, and the construction of said bridge shall be commenced within two years after the passage of this act, and said company or com-panies shall expend within the first year after construction has commenced not less than \$250,000, and in each year thereafter not less than \$100,000 in the actual con-struction work of said bridge, and the said bridge shall be completed within ten years from the commencement of the Unless the actual construction of reeded with and completed within the time and at the rate above provided for this act shall be unll and void.

MILLIONS IN SMOKE

Many Business Houses and Dwellings Wiped Out by a New York Fire. NEW YORK, Oer. 19.—One of the most descructive firm this city has seen since the great Crystal Palace fire of 1808 occurred last evening. The fire extended from St. Raphael's Roman Catholic church on Fortieth street, west of Tenth avenue, to the north side of Forty-second street. The lesses will amount well up into the mill-

The fire was discovered at 8:10 p. m. by a watchman employed by William Camp-bell & Co., wholesale manufacturers of wall papers, at 512 to 518 West Forty-sec-ond street and 505 to 512 West Forty-first street. The five started in the boiler house and had gained great headway before it was discovered. It spread to the adjaining building, occupied by Nevins & Haviland, also will paper magnifacturers, on Tenth avenue and Forty-second street. Both firms are entirely burned out, and the fire quickly worked its way to surrounding
