### THE WAR IN BRAZIL. President Peixoto Probably Preparing for a Battle.

FOREIGN VESSELS WARNED OFF.

Minister Mendonea Fears That the Desertion of Admiral Gams Will be Followed by That of the Whole Naval Force-A Royatist Move-

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 .- The navy de-WARDINGTON, Dec. 12.—The mavy de-partment has received a sable dispatch from Rio de Janeiro that indicates prep-azations by President Peixoto for a big buttle hetwein his forces and those of Ad-miral Mello. The dispatch is from Cap-toin Picking, commanding the United States navel force at Rio, and in substance is as follows: "The Brazillan government has requested forcing measure analysis weak to move from their measure analysis. sels to move from their present anchor-age, and has drawn a line within which it will be dangerous to venture. This will prevent the loading and unloading of \$150 M.

It is not known how far this may inter-fere with the commerce of Rio. The navy department is left in the dark as to the purpose of the order. It may be it is sug-gested, that the erection of a new battery is contemplated, which would make the resent anchorage dangerons.

The Brazillan revolution has assumed a new and much more serious aspective to the deciaration of Admiral Gama in favor of the revolution and of a restoration of the smptre. Minister Mendimen, of Brazil, who has been most active in assisting the Psix ato government, does not seek to be-little the scribusness of Gama's defection. "I know Gamu personally and most in-timately." sold the minister, "and I rea-lize that he gives the rebels a power and prestige they have never before had. Al-though he is a rear admiral of the same rank as Mello, yet Gama is recognized as the most popular and most able man in he mayy. The entire navy is likely to allow Gama, for he has a controlling inthe nevy lucace over most of the officers, and those who would not follow him through respect

vothil do so in four of him. The minister was asked what elements af strongth were now commanded by the

"Admiral Gama has two protected erris ers and two lesser warships inside the harbor of Rin," said he. "Admirni Mello has the bronclads Aquidaban and Repub-lies outside the barbor. Then there are a number of small ships which are likely to follow Gama's orders. In fact the entire navy is likely to be concentrated against internal resources and the army of Brazil.

Senor Mendonca said that Gama's dec-laration in favor of restoring the empire yould probably stimulate the exiled rolica of the empire to contribute large sums tovard the revolution. He proceeded:

"I have little doubt that Admiral Gama had assurances in advance from these wealthy and royal sources before he de-slared for the empire. I know him to be in exceedingly circlul man, so that he yould be likely to take precaution to seurs in advance the co-operation of im-erialists abroad. One thing is certain, owever, and that is that a monarchy will never be restored in Brazil. The effort for t by Gama may bring civil war and disrupt Brazil, but it can never succeed, as Republican institutions are too firmly plantal to be shaken."
