

How contactous diseases are encouraged was shown in ajmost conspicmany form in Buffalo a few days since. An undertaker, in direct violation of the health ordinances of that city, permitted a number of persons to look upon the corpse of a woman who had died of diphtheria by opening the coffin at the grave. That prurient curlo sity, which so frequently prompts people to game upon the dead at whatever risk to themselves, led a number to avail themselves of the injudicious act of the undertaker, and the result has been the death of six of those who were present and drew near the opened coffin. From this disastrous result two morals are to be gleaned. One is that the schoolfollow of Schubert and the persons who die of contagious diseases of any kind should be rigidly excluded from the approach of anybody. An other is that undertakers and others in authority tu cases of death from such causes should be held to stern account for the manner in which they perform the duties assigned them. Another class of people much to blame for the spread of zymotic diseases are those who, in spite of the danger, attend at the funerals of those who die of such diseases. They are without excuse of any kind. There is nothing to justify their course, not even the bonds of affection for the dead. If the health ordinances were enforced to the letter in all places, and those punished who violate them, we should have fewer epidemica.






