# POLICE INVESTIGATION.

The Lexow Committee Again at Work in New York.

EXAMINING THE OFFICIALS NOW

Attorney Goff Calls the Chief Cterk of the Police Headquarters and Ex-Police Commissioner MacLean, Who Says the Civil Service Law Is a Hindrance,

Naw York, Oct. 2.—The Lexow com-nitree resumed its investigations into the police department posterday, after a two weeks vacation, taken to allow the members of the committee to attend the state convention of the Republican and Demo-cratic parties. It is evident that matters crate parties. It is evident that matters are rapidly reaching a climax. The beginning of the sud apparently is in sight. Commencing with the criminals, the very worst men and women in New York with as witnesses. Mr. Goff, the attorney who has been conducting the investigation, has been steadily moving upward in the scale of humanity. ance of attorneys and ministers when the session began. The interest in the pro-ceedings continues unabated. Among the witnesses called was Corporation Counsel Clarke. He was asked why he had designated Mr. Wellman to appear as special counsel to the police board during the re-cent historical trial of a number of of icers, since Mr. Wellman was already drawing a salary as assistant district at-torney. Mr. Clarke said he selected Mr. Wellman because he was familiar with criminal law, and that the appointment was neither wrong nor illegal.

The Right of Workmen to Strike Undoubted.

The court said that Judge Jenkins had

exceeded his powers when he enjoined the employes of the receivers of the Northern Pacific railread company from quittithe service of and receivers, with or with-out notice, so as to cripple the property or prevent the operation of said road. It held, however, that the section should stand in which the men were prohibited "from combining and conspiring to quit, with or without notice, the service of said receivers, with the object and intent of crispling the property in their custody, or ambarrassing the operation of said rail-

The decision was considered by the law The decision was considered by the law-yers who packed the court room as one of the most important opinions delivered in the United States in a decade. It defines the status before the law of labor organ-izations in their conduct of strikes, and affirms the powers of courts of equity to interfere by injunction when there is reason to believe that the law will be vic-lated. It holds that men may writedraw reason to believe that the law will be visited. It holds that men may withdraw in a body from the service of an employer, using, however, neither force, threats, persecution nor intimidation toward employes who do not join them, nor must they use any "device to molest, hinder, alarm or interfere with others who desire to take their places."

Justice Harlan, of the supreme court, delivered the spinion. Sitting with him were Judges Woods, Bunn, Grosscup and Jenkins. The last named sat with his eyes fixed upon Harlan as the latter results opinion rechaving the circuit judge's

the opinion reviewing the circuit judge's action. Judge Jenkins appeared undis action. Judge Jenkii turbed by the opinion.

The audience which listened to the reading of the opinion was a most distinguished one. Ex.President Harrison and his partner, Mr. Elam, sat side by side, well up toward the beach. After dispose weit up toward the bench. After disposeing of cases in which the findings of the court were merely amounced by Judges Woods and Jenkins, Justice Harlan beg at the reading of the case of P. M. Arhur c al., interveners, against Thomas M.Oakes Henry C. Payne and Henry C. Rouse, re-ceivers of the Northern Pacific Railrond ompany, as this celebrated case is known in the docket.
