WORK OF THE STORM.

Fifty Vessels Wrecked on Newfoundland's Coast. GREAT LOSS OF LIFE PROBABLE. Thirty Lives Lost at St. Pierre, Miramichi.

St. JOHN'S, N. F., Oct. 11.—A northeast gale of exceptional force swept over this island Tuesday night. The storm was very severe at St. Pierre, Miramichi, where thirty lives were lost and great damage was done.

Altogether there were nearly 300 vessels at the port, not a single one of which escaped without sustaining some damage.

Long Branch Hotels Wrecked. LONG BRANCH, Oct. 11.—The storm damage here is grave. About 100 feet of piling of the new iron pier was washed out.

Rescued by Life Savers. ATLANTA CITY, Oct. 11.—The three masted schooner Lucrea Reed, of Somers' post, N. J., Captain Morris Ingersoll, bound from Jersey City to English Creek, laden with coal, stranded abreast of the Ocean City life saving station.

Four Drowned Near Oyster Bay. OYSTER BAY, L. I., Oct. 11.—Four persons were drowned by the sinking of a large tug in the bay.

Outdone by the Uniformed "Procurers of the Peace." WITNESSES BOLDLY THREATENED.

One Officer Declares That He "Will Lay for Them Some Dark Night." Police Bureau Arrested of Plucking Pockets—Interest in the Game of Policy.

New York, Oct. 11.—For the third time since the Lexow investigations commenced, Chief Counsel Goff yesterday produced evidence to show that threats have been made to force a stop to the witnesses who have appeared before the senators conducting the examination.
