

China Asks the Powers to End the Eastern War.

WILLING TO PAY AN INDEMNITY.

Great Britain Will Ask France to Co-operate with Her to That End-Japa Still Marching Triumphantly Forward - Destruction of Fung-Wang-Ching Confirmed.

LONDON, Nov. 6.—The Daily News says that the Chinese minister has imparted to the foreign office China's destre that the powers mediate with Japan for power. The powers mediate with Japan for peace. The minister has gone to Paris to make a similar request of France. In a leader com-menting on the foregoing The Daily News says that China has approached the powers with the terms of peace she will offer Japan. This is a formal renewal on a larges scale of the overtures made to the larges scale of the overtures made to the queen's ministers a month ago. Lord Boschery's course could not have been more completely and conclusively vindicated. No European power can well do sire to prolong this disastrous conflict.
