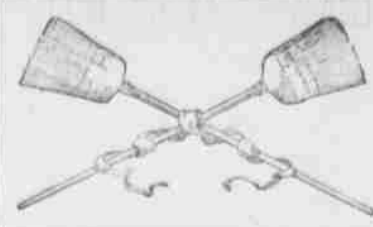
Maryland Goes Republican. BALTIMORE, Nov. 7.—Returns up to midnight that Maryland, for the first time in a great many years, has gone Republican.

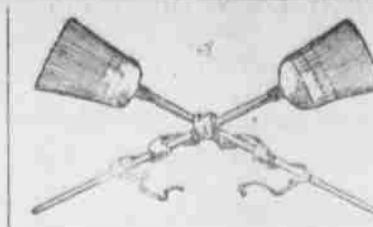

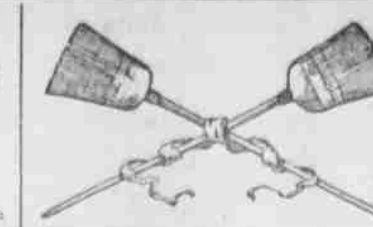
