Stewart of Norristown; private secretary, Lewis E. Beller of Philadelphia.

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 30.—Jephthah D. Howe, an attorney having an office with McDonald & Howe, of this city, was arrested on the charge of conspiring with one H. H. Holmes, to defraud the Fidelity Mutual Life Insurance company, of Philadelphia, out of \$100,000.

Romantic Deathbed Marriages.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Nov. 30.—A romantic deathbed marriage occurred at Riverton, a small town near here, Colonel George B. Richardson, a rich bachelor, finding that he was about to die, and desiring that his housekeeper, Miss Marion E. McNeely, a maiden of 64 years, be left all his property, sent to the city and secured a license, and the couple were married by Justice Knott at the sick man's bedside.

Their Brief Battle Ended by Police Interference.

THE CONTEST DECLARED A DRAW.

The Stungling Battle Too Heavy for the Officers of the Law, and They Took a Hand at the End of the Third Round. Zeigler Hit the Best of It.

CONY ISLAND, N. Y., Nov. 30.—The fact that Jack McAuliffe was to appear last night, this time in a more professional manner, against a representative of the Quaker City, attracted a crowd of 3,500 lovers of the manly art to the Atlantic Athletic Club's arena here.

There was a long delay before the contest of the evening was called, and both men looked fit to fight for their lives when they entered the ring.

First Round—Zeigler at once proceeded to mix matters, and the Philadelphia's stock went up a good many points.

Second Round—McAuliffe led off with his left, and the Quaker clinched. McAuliffe swung wide and got a left hand swing from Zeigler in return.

After the contestants left the ring it was discovered that McAuliffe had broken two of the small bones in his left wrist.
