TO EXHUME THE BODY.

Mrs. Pitezel Will be Given an Opportunity to Identify It.

HUNTING THE ALLEGED DEAD MAN.

The Chicago Police Believe They Have a Clue That Will Lead to the Discovery of Pitezel—The Philadelphia Prisoners Now in Mourning.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 24.—The Pitezel-Holmes-Howe conspiracy murder mystery has taken an interesting and important turn by the announcement from an official source that the body of Perry, or Pitezel, will again be exhumed and another effort made to identify it.

It will be remembered by those who have followed the history of this extraordinary case that Mrs. Pitezel never saw the dead body of the man who was said to be her husband.

So that all doubt in this connection may be removed, the intelligence comes from an authoritative source that the body will be re-exhumed so that Mrs. Pitezel may be given all the facilities possible for determining whether or not it is the body of her husband.

Yesterday Holmes and Mrs. Pitezel were committed to Moyamensing prison, there to await trial.

Lawyer Harry Hawkins has been retained to defend Holmes, the money being furnished by a mysterious friend from Chicago.

There was a new development yesterday when it was learned that the detectives are looking for an expressman who had been seen with Pitezel and who disappeared about the time the body was found.

Holmes' lawyers state that they will show by documents on record that at the time of the alleged identification of Pitezel that shadowy individual was personally conducting a real estate transaction in this city.

THE ALLEGED DEAD MAN.

Chicago Police Believe They Have a Clue to Pitezel's Whereabouts.

CHICAGO, Nov. 24.—The Chicago police have obtained a clue regarding Benjamin F. Pitezel, the accomplice of H. H. Holmes alias Howard, who is now detained at Philadelphia on charges of having swindled an insurance company out of \$10,000.

A letter was received from Pitezel from St. Louis in which he promised to soon clear the standing indebtedness on his furniture and effect its removal.
